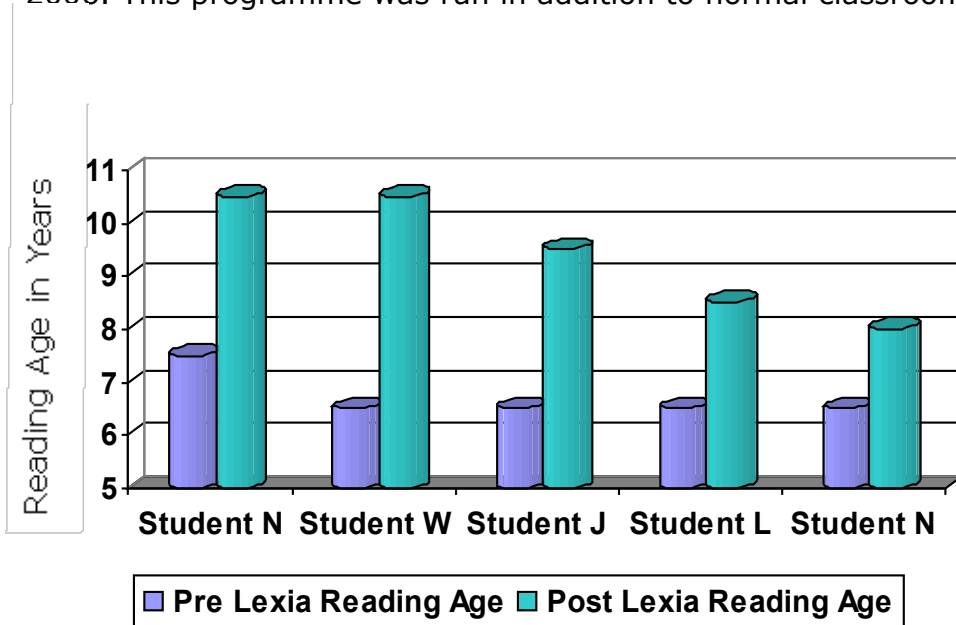


Report to School Management on Lexia Reading Program Results 2006

Reported increases based on Probe Running records pre and post. Students used Lexia SOS reading program 3 x week (20mins sessions) with parent help support during 2006. This programme was run in addition to normal classroom reading.



Anecdotal Evidence

The most satisfying aspect has been the student's attitude to reading and their belief in their own ability. It has managed to bring up students reading age who have been stuck at the same level for up to 6 years. The boys in particular seem to enjoy seeing their obvious visual progress on the graphs.

Several other students made pleasing gains and for some it did not seem to make much difference. The social interaction and mentoring factor between parents and students was another big plus for nearly all of these students and had a positive effect on student's behaviour.

For those students with reading ages below 7yrs the Lexia Primary Reading programme seems more appropriate, but for those who find this too childish they can cope with "Strategies for Older Students".

Some teachers have use the programme successfully within the classroom, but the majority have used the programme in the library or with me.
